Notes

To be eligible for election to the Board of Directors, candidates must be paid up, **full members of Endurance GB**. Those wishing to stand must be proposed and seconded. Both the Proposer and Secunder must also be paid up, full members of Endurance GB.

Those **not** eligible to stand for election to the Board of Directors of Endurance GB are as follows:

- Any person debarred from being a Director of a Company
- Members under the age of 16 years
- Associate members

Those proposing to be nominated for election should not campaign to the membership directly or indirectly through friends, families or via Groups. They are also advised to refer to the additional information sheet below, so that they are fully aware of the legal liabilities they will undertake on becoming a Director of Endurance GB.

If elected you will be bound by standard company good practices relating to behaviour, confidentiality and disclosure of interests, and agree not to bring Endurance GB into disrepute. By putting yourself forward to be elected you are agreeing that if you are elected you will undertake to comply with and adhere to the above. It should also be noted that if elected, a candidate may be asked to undertake any role on the Board depending on the final skills and experience profile of the whole Board.

Each nomination **must** be accompanied by a brief profile extending to no more than 400 words written by the candidate explaining why he or she considers themselves suitable to stand for election as a member of the Board, and the skills they will bring to the Board that are relevant to vacant role(s). Candidates must submit an honest and truthful profile or their application; falsification of information may result in the nomination being void - if elected the directorship may be terminated at any time. By submitting a nomination, you are agreeing to all terms and conditions applied to directors of Endurance GB.

Being a Board Member represents a significant commitment and demand on people's time and one not to be taken on lightly. However, it is not beyond the reach of any Member with the necessary skills and can be enjoyable and personally rewarding.

The Board should be representative of the membership. As well as having their own specialised business, professional and life skills and a good knowledge of endurance, Directors need to be flexible, committed to hard work and driven to meet tight deadlines, willing to shoulder their fair share of Board duties. They also need to generate and be receptive to new ideas, improvements and change so that our Organisation continues to develop and grow. Experience of strategic thinking, team working and reaching sound corporate decisions within a professional Board / Committee environment is essential, as is the ability to listen, communicate rationally but diplomatically.
