Ring 1:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1) ENTRIES

- a) Entries must be made using the online entry system at www.british-breeding.com and with full payment of the entry fee.
- b) Entry fees are £25 per class, or £22.50 for members. Non-members can join at <https://british-breeding.com/british-breeding-members-club>.
- c) Each exhibitor will be held responsible for the correctness of his entries. The Partnership will not accept responsibility for the correctness of any pedigree or other particulars inserted in the Show Catalogue, although every care will be taken to ensure accuracy.
- d) Please check registration documents before submitting entries; the animal's name MUST be the name registered with the Studbook. Prefix and Suffixes are allowed as long as the full registered name is present.
- e) Animals will be catalogued under the name of the registered owner.
- f) No foal under three weeks old on the date of the show may take part in any class.
- g) **Late entries** may be accepted by the Show Organiser and will incur an additional fee of £20 per class.
- h) **Refunds.** No refund of entry fees will be made unless a request for refund is accompanied by a vet's certificate.
- i) The Partnership reserves the right to amalgamate or cancel any Class and refuse entries without explanation.

2) HEALTH & VACCINATIONS

- a) All horses except foals will be required to have up to date vaccinations against equine influenza. This means that they must have received two primary injections and be consistently boosted not more than 12 months apart **and must have received a booster not more than 6 months and not less than 7 days before the event.** Original passports must be presented to the show office for checking on arrival prior to unloading.
- b) No animal must be brought to the Show if he/she has been seen to have or been in the presence of any symptoms that might relate to Equine Flu in the days preceding the Show including; a dry harsh, hacking cough; fever; feeling lethargic and depressed; loss of appetite.
- c) Please do not touch anybody else's horses or ponies, and please do not pass your horses or ponies on to anybody else to hold, as they could have been in direct contact with other horses, unless you have made that arrangement previously. Please do not allow anybody touch your horses or ponies.
- d) Please do not allow your horses or ponies to touch or sniff any other horses or ponies, and maintain a safe distance at all times.
- e) Hand sanitisers will be placed in key locations, please make use of them!
- f) If you have any concerns on the day, please do not hesitate to ask for assistance.

3) DRESS

- a) Riders, grooms and attendants appearing in the ring with horses must be dressed appropriately (no jeans or shorts) with appropriate headwear and footwear. Any person not complying with this regulation may be asked to leave by the steward.
- b) **HARD HATS** - It is mandatory for **ALL handlers** to wear a protective helmet manufactured to conform with current approved BSI or European Standard in the arena and outside. Such headgear must be

worn with the chinstrap correctly and securely fastened at all times when handling horses of any age on the showground. Hats or helmets requiring covers must be covered with plain, dark coloured silks. The Partnership accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

- c) It is strongly recommended that all handlers should wear gloves.
- d) The use of headcams is strictly prohibited.

4) TACK AND HANDLING

- a) Broodmare – snaffle bridle and lead rein or reins (unless, for safety reasons, another type of bridle is more suitable). Broodmares may wear boots or bandages if required. Broodmares will not be judged in foal classes. In the event of embryo transfer foals we realise that the broodmares will be recipient mares. In the event of orphan foals, any equine companion is allowed to accompany the foal.
- b) Foal – leather foal slip/headcollar and lead rein with a clip that is easy and quick to undo but still safe.
- c) Yearling and two year old – Yearlings are generally shown wearing an in-hand bitless bridle or leather headcollar and lead rein. Yearlings are permitted to wear an in hand bridle with bit if you prefer. Two year old colts must wear a snaffle bridle. Two year old mares and geldings may be shown in an in-hand bitless bridle, snaffle bridle or leather headcollar. Please use a clip that is easy and quick to undo but still safe.
- d) Three year old – snaffle bridle. Please use a clip that is easy and quick to undo but still safe.
- e) **All stallions must have competent handlers.** All Stallions must be lead with a bridle when not in their stable. Once the Show has started all stallions MUST wear their allotted bridle number at all times when not in their stable.
- f) **Horses not under proper control** will be asked to leave the arena.
- g) All exhibitors must ensure supervision of their animals at all times whilst the animals are on the Showground.

5) CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS/ATTENDANTS & EXPULSION FROM SHOWGROUND

- a) Any act of discourtesy to any steward, Official or Organiser on the part of the exhibitor, groom, rider, attendant, handler, driver or agent of an animal will, at the discretion of such official, disqualify that animal from being taking part, in which case entry fees will be forfeited.
- b) Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for any penalties imposed for misconduct.
- c) **The Decision of the Judges is final.** Objections must be submitted in writing to the Show Organiser with £50 deposit, no later than 30 minutes after the incident. If the objection is sustained the deposit will be returned.

6) **Dogs are not allowed unless on a lead and under full control.**

7) INDEMNITY

- a) Breeding Partnership Ltd, trading as British Breeding, its officers, employees, agents or subcontractors (together the “**Partnership**”) will not be liable for or accountable to any person for:
 - i) any accident or injury, fatal or otherwise, or for any disease, damage or loss that may occur to any person;
 - ii) any theft, damage, destruction or loss of property;

- iii) loss or damage that may occur to or be caused by any animal, article or vehicle exhibited or brought on to the Showground or car parks.
 - b) Nothing in this disclaimer shall limit or exclude the Partnership's liability for:
 - i) death or personal injury or damage to property caused by negligence on the part of the Partnership; or
 - ii) any matter in respect of which it would be unlawful for the Partnership to exclude or restrict liability.
 - c) Each exhibitor, rider, its employees, agents or subcontractors (together the "**Exhibitor**") shall be held solely liable for any accident, loss, injury or damage that may occur to or be caused by any animal, article, vehicle or property exhibited or brought on to the Showground or car parks by the Exhibitor.
 - d) The Exhibitor shall indemnify and keep the Partnership indemnified against all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses and damages, including a claim made against the Partnership by a third party for death, personal injury or damage to property (including but not limited to any direct, indirect or consequential losses, loss of profit, loss of reputation and all interest, penalties and legal and other professional costs and expenses) suffered or incurred by the Partnership as a result of or in connection with any animal, article, vehicle or property brought on to the Showground or car parks by the Exhibitor.
 - e) Acceptance of the provisions of this disclaimer shall be a condition of entry.
 - f) The Exhibitor will have in force, maintain and comply with the terms of its own appropriate insurance to cover all risks and liabilities which the Exhibitor may incur.
 - g) The Partnership reserves the right to refuse and to cancel any entries and relax any conditions or regulations as the Partnership may deem expedient.
 - h) The Partnership reserves the sole right of decision to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such decision arises from events outside of the control of the Partnership, the Partnership shall not accept liability for any indirect or consequential loss, loss of profit, loss of reputation, all interests and penalties financial or otherwise arising thereby, nor for the refund of any fees and charges paid.
 - i) Subject to clause 1(b), the Partnership's maximum aggregate liability (for breach of contract or arising in tort or on any other basis whatsoever) shall be limited to the entry fee paid by the Exhibitor.
- 8) **CAR PARKS** - Cars, lorries, coaches, motorcycles and cycles admitted will be left along with contents entirely at the owner's risk.
